Hearing the Voices of People Long Silenced A Letter from Pastor Charlie

We often share excerpts from "A Brief Statement of Faith" in worship. I love this statement, as it concisely articulates who we are and how we are called to be the church. (I also am grateful that it was approved in 1991, the year I was ordained.) Here's a short history lesson about the BSF and the role of women in the church:

In 1956, Margaret Towner was the first woman ordained as a Presbyterian pastor in the USA.

In 1975, Walter Wynn Kenyon was denied ordination in the Presbyterian Church, because he did not support the ordination of women. The "Kenyon Case" was big news, as the church was affirming women's ordination as an essential tenet of our faith.

In 1983, the northern and southern branches of the Presbyterian church unified, after splitting in 1844 over slavery.

In 1991, "A Brief Statement of Faith" became part of our Book of Confessions, an official affirmation of our church. Mindful of lingering questions about the role of women in the church, the BSF affirms equality three separate places:

- "In sovereign love God created the world good and makes everyone equally in God's image male and female, of every race and people, to live as one community."
- "In everlasting love, the God of Abraham **and Sarah** [emphasis mine] chose a covenant people to bless all families of the earth."
- "The same Spirit who inspired the prophets and apostles . . . and calls women and men to all ministries of the church."

Then near the end of the BSF, we affirm:

• "In a broken and fearful world the Spirit gives us courage . . . to hear the voices of peoples long silenced..."

In September, we have a four-week sermon series on women in the book of Genesis. Too many of us have heard only about Adam, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and Joseph—and hardly anything about Eve, Sarah, Hagar, Leah, Rachel, Dinah, and others, with the hope of hearing their long silenced voices and stories. The Adult Ed Committee is also launching a Bible study of book of Genesis. See page 5 for more info.

In the BSF, I've always appreciated that phrase about hearing the voices of people long silenced. It encourages me to pause and strive to hear others. Jesus had a wonderful way of making everyone feel heard, especially the lost, the least, and the last. It's too easy for us to simply keep listening to the loudest and most powerful voices—in politics, at the dinner table, and everywhere in between. Faithful Christians need to listen to everyone.

Congrats to Doug McNeel for 20 years at Covenant!

As of September 3, 2022, Doug McNeel will have served for 20 years as Covenant's organist. Doug is a (as you already know) phenomenal organist, and has played organs all over the globe. Did you know that Doug is also Professor of Medicine at UW-Madison. He dedicates much of his career to cancer treatment. We honored Doug in worship on August 28. Thank you for all you do, Doug!

Mission Spotlight Pres House

Mission partner Pres House aims to be a spiritual home at the heart of the UW-Madison campus. This spiritual home is more than just a house for worship and a residence for hundreds of UW-Madison students. Pres House aims to be a home through which a community is built which: rests on a sturdy foundation but is in a continual state of remodeling and spiritual growth;



nourishes the physical body through weekly meals, but nourishes souls through worship services and fellowship; serves to witness Jesus Christ in the reformed Presbyterian tradition, but is welcoming and open to people with any or no faith background. Pres House is openly affirming to people from the LGBTQ+ community and encourages everyone to "bring all of who you are."

Pres House engages the public mostly, but not exclusively UW-Madison students, through weekly Sunday afternoon worship services and meals prepared by volunteers. Last year, Covenant volunteers have gathered once each semester to cook, serve, and share meals while participating in fellowship with students and leadership. While weekly services are an important part of the Pres House outreach efforts, they are far from the only activity in which Pres House engages. During summer months, Pres House organizes weekly mid-week Church Unbound gatherings which encourages participants to engage in thoughtful conversation while sharing a meal and exploring different parts of Madison. Graduate students are invited to weekly coffee hours. Other social events include a trip to a pumpkin patch, a weekend retreat at a bible camp on Lake Waubesa, and a Yule Ball.

Pres House provides leadership and service opportunities to an active Student Council which plans and organizes events throughout the year. Some students who wish to share their musical talents form a music team which provides music during weekly services. Residents also engage in volunteer service projects. Pres House fosters an environment where the residents and participants in the program engage in deep discussion of important issues of the day, but also seek opportunities to act in the community to help carry out God's will.

Covenant is one of many Presbyterian churches in the area whose mission outreach provides meals, but also supports Pres House financially. Covenant shares several thousand dollars each year to support the programming at Pres House. Several Covenant members also make generous individual gifts. All donations received by Pres House supports their mission as a spiritual home for collegeage students in Madison and Covenant is an important partner in helping Pres House carry out this mission.

Session Report

Your Session met for their regularly scheduled meeting on August 23, having taken the month of July off. A great deal of the time was spent looking forward. The Session is discussing when to form the Associate Pastor Nominating Committee (APNC) and has formed a team to write up and update the Mission Study. The Session will hold a retreat with Deacons and select staff on September 17 with Rev. Loren Shellabarger of Iowa, conducting a Strengths, Weakness, Opportunities and Threats (SWOT) analysis. There should be 3-5 actionable items that come out of the discussions which may inform the Mission Study. Also looking forward, the Personnel Committee is working to fill a new part-time staff position for livestreaming the worship service (this has become more complicated than just clicking through the slides in worship!). The interim youth ministry staffing plan was approved and how to address it long-term was discussed. A Congregational Meeting has been called to elect officers on October 30 at 10am.

The Building & Grounds Committee reported they are coming to a close on the boiler project and will be contracting for professional floor cleaning when done. The sanctuary chancel lighting, being over 50 years old, is being updated with new, more energy efficient fixtures. The Interior Committee is working on purchasing new furniture for the heavily used Lounge.

The upcoming trip to Guatemala will include several projects for which funding was approved, bimonthly meals for the Porchlight Men's Shelter will be resumed, and funding was approved to help sponsor Nehemiah Center for Urban Leadership Development's 30th Anniversary Celebration.

The Session remains engaged and is putting effort into looking into our future and how we can help share the love of Jesus Christ in the community around us and across the nation and globe. Thank you for your prayers of support.
