A Letter From Pastor Charlie

What will be written in your obituary? What will the pastor say at your funeral? Have you talked with loved ones about burial or cremation? Are your affairs in order?

l apologize for the blunt questions, but I've been involved with several families in grief this month, and I've seen the benefit of honest discussion about death.

We're all going to die. Our loved ones are going to die. So why not clarify if you want to be cremated or not and where you want your remains to end up? Why not think about any songs or scripture verses that you'd want to have at your memorial service?

And perhaps most importantly, why not think about what you want your legacy to be, how you want to be remembered, what kind of impact you want to make on the world, your community, your family?

The call of Jesus is to live with purpose—to love neighbors and enemies, to be kind and generous, to be courageous and compassionate, to serve the Kingdom of God. How are you doing with that calling?

My father died suddenly at age 72 many years ago. At his memorial service the pastor read part of Psalm 90, including the excerpt above, which reminds us that life is short. Ever since then many of my prayers have begun with gratitude for the gift of life, for the gift of today.

And I also pray regularly in the spirit of Psalm 90 that God would prosper the work of my hands, to help me live a useful and productive life.

Now is as good a time as any for heartfelt conversations—with family, friends, or church staff—about life and death and purpose. May God prosper the work of your hands and give you grace to make the most of every day.



Library Corner: Glimpses

If, like me, you've ever found yourself missing the warmth, wisdom, and wordplay of Covenant's late Pastor Emeritus Bill King, reading his 2012 collection of poems *Glimpses* will feel like a de-



lightful reunion of sorts. Divided into three sections based on where he composed them (the Antrim Coast of Northern Ireland; Madison, WI; and the family cabin on Cut Foot Sioux Lake in the Chippewa National Forest), these wide-ranging poems take as their inspiration the seemingly pedestrian ("Jello Salad"; "Hangnail") as well as the weighty and philosophical ("Mourning"; "Reality"). What they share is King's commitment to finding evidence—glimpses, as he calls them—of the Kingdom of God in the very mixed bag of human experience.

To read these poetic glimpses into Bill's rich inner life—his searching, ponderings, questions, appreciations, and doubts—is to feel like a cherished guest who has been granted the gift of a wise friend's honest vulnerability and loving attention.

Presbywheelians Ride Again on July 17th!

Members of Covenant Presbyterian, Pres House, and other Presbyterian denominations have been putting together teams for Bike 4 Boys & Girls Club since 2012. In total we have raised \$72,441 for the charity. We will be fielding another team for the ride at McKee Farms Park in Fitchburg on July 17th.

The Boys & Girls Club is active in our community and making a difference every day. Our local chapter does a lot beyond the great work of providing afterschool activities. In 2021 and beyond, BGC is developing a Skilled Trades Training Center to mitigate the opportunity gap and provide long term skills training for youth. Our offering supports a brighter future for youth in our community.

Mission Spotlight: JustDane

A year ago, Madison Urban Ministry (MUM) received a new name to reflect its expanding reach; JustDane. Covenant has provided both financial and volunteer support for many years to this vital organization. JustDane is a private, non-profit agency that provides a range of services to individuals and families caught up in the



criminal justice system. Those services include prison reentry programs such as job training in JustDane's Just Bakery program, and Circles of Support, in which Covenant participated a number of years ago, providing a support system to individuals recently released from prison. JustDane, along with our friends at the Road Home, also runs Healing House, an 8-bed facility that provides a place for children and adults who are homeless but need to recuperate after a hospital stay, to receive care and meals. Covenant members provide meals to Healing House on a regular basis.

During the pandemic, JustDane adapted to rapidly changing circumstances. For example, Just Bakery began offering online classes and baked thousands of loaves of bread for area food pantries. The agency also distributed rent assistance to numerous individuals. More recently, JustDane has received a Rapid Rehousing Project contract from the City of Madison with the goal of assisting participants to find stable housing by May of 2022.

July Session Update

Your Session met for their regularly scheduled meeting on June 22. In-person worship seems to be going very well and, with the approval of the Reopening the Building Task Force, social distancing tape in the pews will be removed for the summer. Masks will continue to be worn in the building. A re-evaluation of the protocol will take place in September before the program year begins. Outside groups are slowly coming back and are required to follow our Covid guidelines. The staff and leadership are sensitive that people have varying degrees of comfort levels with gathering together again. It is our hope that people will return as they are comfortable and that each individual is seeking vaccination if they have not already done so.

The Building and Grounds Committee has been hard at work and brought several items to Session. The reconstruction of the Pastors' restroom was approved and will be completed following a successful bid process. The insurance policy for Covenant is being evaluated, as it's to be renewed in September. Finally, work continues to replace the boiler and heating system throughout the CE Wing. Completion of this work must precede the renovations of the counters in the Sunday School rooms, a project long delayed from the 2017-2019 Capital Campaign. By delaying the classroom renovations, we are able to avoid completing and paying for the work twice. The funding for the heating system replacement will come from Covenant savings/member equity.

The Ruling Elders work hard each month to ensure the work of the church is done in a timely and caring fashion. They have answered the call to lead. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact any one of them. *Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?"
